Aultsville Train Station

County Road #2, Morrisburg
Sat. Sept. 7th – 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th – 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm

Visit the original Aultsville Train Station, an attractive 19th century wooden station, originally located in the Lost Village of Aultsville and used by the Grand Trunk Railway Company. The "British Home Child" exhibit is to be unveiled.

Ontario Power Generation's (OPG) St. Lawrence Power Development Visitor Centre is located on the north bank of the St. Lawrence River, just east of the Robert H. Saunders Generating Station, in the west end of Cornwall, Ontario.

Cornwall Community Museum

Sun. Sept. 8th - 11:00 am to 4:00 pm

Your visit will include a 1900 kitchen filled with Cornwall's famous Flack and Van Arsdale crocks; a study circa 1910; a 1950's Seaway Era dining room with Beach furniture; the Loyalist parlour; Special Chalet Glass Exhibit.

Historic Cornwall Jail

11 Water Street West, Cornwall

Sun. Sept. 8th - 10:00 am to 3:00 pm

The jail closed in 2002 in favour of newer facilities in major cities, but the exercise yard, visitation area, common areas and cell blocks have been maintained. Step into a cell to experience life behind bars. Learn about the history and prison life.

Lost Villages Museum

The Museum is a collection of 11 heritage buildings with displays depicting and telling the story of the great Hydro & Seaway projects of the 1950s. Former residents of the actual lost villages will be on site with many personal memories. The Stuart House will be open for viewing.

Salem United Church

Sun. Sept. 8th - 9:00 am to 1:00 pm (Service at 9 am)

Salem Church is one of the first congregations estab-

lished in Glengarry by Rev. John Bethune in 1787 and has served the community for 222 years. Visitors are welcomed to the intimate sanctuary to participate in Sunday Service.

St. John's Anglican Church

20788 South Service Road, Lancaster
Sat. Sept. 7th - 10:00 am to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm

The church was erected on the MacLennan estate, called Ridgewood. It is a real gem of a small cruciform church, complete with belfry and a peal of three bells. It is located on the South Service Road surrounded by the Glengarry Provincial Park and Lancaster Park, and is commonly referred to as "The Church in the Wild-wood".

Glengarry Pioneer Museum

1645 County Road #30, Dunvegan
Sat. Sept. 7th - 10:00 am to 5:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 10:00 am to 5:00 pm

Tucked in the heart of this sleepy hamlet, the growing museum interprets Glengarry history dating back to the turn of the 19th century, when the United Empire Loyalists and Scottish immigrants arrived in the area to start new lives.

St. Raphaels Ruins

County Road #18, St. Raphaels
Sat. Sept. 7th - 10:00 am to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm

In 1970 a fire consumed the church of St. Raphaels leaving only bare stone walls. Explore the ruins of this church built in 1821, cemetery stones and the old bell.

Sir John Johnson Manor House

19692 William Street, Williamstown
Sat. Sept. 7th – 10:00 am to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

One of the oldest homes in Ontario, this five-bay Georgian-style log house was constructed for Sir John Johnson between 1784 and 1792. With its associated grist and saw mills, the house became a focus for the community of United Empire Loyalists and the fur traders of the North-west Company.

Nor'westers & Loyalist Museum

19651 John Street, Williamstown

Sun. Sept. 8th - 11:00 am to 5:00 pm

The museum comprehensively depicts the story of Sir John Johnson and Loyalist followers who settled here during the American Revolution in 1784. The "Wonders from our Attic" exhibit is to be unveiled.

Bethune Thompson House

19730 John Street, Williamstown
Sat. Sept. 7th – 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 12:00 pm to 5:00 pm

This house encompasses the original 1784 "poteaux sur sol" cabin of loyalist Peter Fergusson, as well as the 1804 house of Rev. John Bethune (the first Presbyterian minister in Upper Canada) and David Thompson (one of Canada's earliest mapmakers).

Raisin River Heritage Centre

County Road 18, St. Andrews West
Sat. Sept. 7th - 11:00 am to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 11:00 am to 4:00 pm

The Heritage Centre is the "hub" for historical information for the village of St. Andrews. Walk around this small community and visit the church and parish hall, the log church replica, the pioneer graveyard. Interpreters on site.

Martintown Grist Mill

Dundas Street (just east of bridge), Martintown
Sat. Sept. 7th - 10:00 am to 4:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 10:00 am to 4:00 pm

The Martintown Mill was built in 1846 by Alexander McMartin. It served the community until 1947. The old mill was near collapse but has been successfully stabilized.

Cannamore Orchard Farm Museum

1480 County Road #32, between Morewood & Crysler
Sat. Sept. 7th - 10:00 am to 5:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 10:00 am to 5:00 pm

Cannamore Orchard has created an exhibition of materials related to apples, strawberries, maple sugar, tapping and honey production. Artifacts show tools used over the last century. Agriculture display free this weekend. Interpreters on site.

Cornwall Public Library

45 Second Street East, Cornwall
Sat. Sept. 7th - 9:30 am to 5:00 pm
Sun. Sept. 8th - 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm

What was once The Federal Post Office Building, The Cornwall Public Library was designated as a historical site in 1997 for representing a unique example of institutional international style architecture. Guided tour of the seldom seen Library basement, which features the former Capitol Theatre and bomb shelter will take place Saturday at 10:30am & 2:00pm, and Sunday at 1:00pm.

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
